Dear Colleagues,

Congratulations to your graduating seniors! Thank you so much for all the support and guidance you provided to your students and their families through the college application process. As we reach the end of the school year, we would like to share some updates from Cambridge.

Expanded Financial Aid

Beginning in the 2025-2026 academic year, Harvard College will be free for students from families with annual incomes of \$100,000 or less and will provide free tuition plus additional aid to students from families with annual incomes of \$200,000 or less. Many students from families earning more than \$200,000 annually will also qualify for aid. This significant expansion will ensure that more students, especially from middle-income families, will receive the support they need to attend.

We are pleased to share that under Harvard College's supportive financial aid program, which provides need-based assistance to all Harvard undergraduates, 25% of our students' families pay nothing for their child to attend Harvard.

QuestBridge Partnership

We strive to administer a college application and financial aid program that makes Harvard accessible and attractive to the best students. This year, we have committed to participating in QuestBridge for the 2025 National College Match. Harvard-specific requirements will be released when the QuestBridge application opens around July 30, 2025. 
Admissions: What Are We **Looking For?**

We seek promising students who will contribute to the Harvard community during their college years and to society throughout their lives. While academic accomplishment is important, the Admissions Committee considers many other factors—strong personal qualities, special talents or excellences of all kinds, varied perspectives, and the ability to take advantage of available resources and opportunities.

Financial Aid: Removing **Economic Barriers**

Applying for financial aid does not jeopardize any student's chance for admission, including international applicants. All of Harvard's financial aid is awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need there are no academic, athletic. or merit-based awards. Harvard meets 100% of demonstrated need of every student for all four years.

Beginning in the 2025-2026 academic year, Harvard College will be free (including tuition, fees, food, housing, and more) for students from families with annual incomes of less than \$100,000 with typical assets.

Students from families earning \$200,000 or less with typical assets will qualify for free tuition, plus additional aid. Many students from families earning more than \$200,000 will also qualify for aid.

Our financial aid officers work closely with families to ensure that Harvard is accessible to all admitted students. We do not require students to take out loans. although they are asked to cover their personal expenses through term-time work.
